To understand how working together can benefit your child, it is first important to understand the district's and school's goals for student academic achievement.

Hall County School System Goals:

- FY26 Goal 1: By the end of FY26, the percentage of all students moving into the "Proficient and Distinguished" (combined) levels of performance on the Georgia Milestones Assessments will increase by 2%.
- FY26 Goal 2: By the end of FY26, increase the percentage of referred students who access school based mental health services in order to increase the overall school climate rating for HCSD by 1% (from 86.74 to 87.74).

Flowery Branch Elementary School Improvement Goals 2025 - 2026:

- By the end of SY26, the percentage of students in the 41% and above will increase by 2% on map Reading and Math on Spring 25 to Spring 26 data.
- To increase Georgia Milestones Science scores, FBES teachers will provide science Enrichment clusters to all FBES students eight times during the 25-26 school year.
- By the end of SY26, FBES will maintain or decrease physical aggression by 2% during the 25-26 school year.

- Offer parent conferences, either in person, over the phone, or via Zoom, to fully explain grade-level expectations, students' current level of progress, and strategies to increase student achievement in math and literacy.
- Provide parents with frequent reports on their children's progress via Weekly Folders.
- Provide Parent Institute E-Tips to parents monthly via Social Media and/or The Arrow, the school newsletter

- Encourage my child to read at home each night and ask my child questions (who, what, when, where, how, and why) about books.
- Help my child practice basic math facts at home.

- Attend school and curriculum-focused events and workshops.
- Utilize tips from the parent workshops to help my child at home.
